- A right is a freedom that is protected. Different countries have different rights.
- Canada has the charter of rights and freedoms which outlines you rights as a Canadian:
  - Equality rights
  - Democratic rights
  - Legal rights
  - Mobility rights
  - Language rights
  - Minority language education rights
  - Religion, thought, expression



# RESPONSIBILITIES

- A responsibility is a duty or something that someone should do.
- A responsibility can be:
  - A chore at home or school
  - Following rules
  - Helping community members for the common good
  - Obeying laws




# **EXAMPLES:**

- Religion:
  - Everyone has the <u>RIGHT</u> to practice their own religion
  - BUT everyone has the <u>RESPONSIBILITY</u> to respect people of different religions



# EXAMPLES:

- School:
  - In school every child has the <u>RIGHT</u> to learn
  - BUT every child has the <u>RESPONSIBILITY</u> of arriving to school on time, completing homework, and following school and class rules



#### **EXAMPLES:**

- Voting:
  - Is both a right and responsibility
  - Voters have the <u>RESPONSIBILITY</u> to learn about the candidates and proposed laws
  - And have the <u>RIGHT</u> to vote
